Artist Francine Tohannie, a member of the To-Moak Shoshone Tribe in Nevada, depicts the traditional "Burden Basket," made and used by the Washoe, Paiute and Shoshore people.

"The Burden Basket represents the resilience of the land - what it had offered to our ancestors that we still use and teach boday From sagebrush bork, they made clothing and shoes, houses, rope. From the willow, they made intended baskets and utnesses."

Conservation, our hope for the future is symbolized by the new sprouting sagebrush in the foreground.

Preserve the serene beauty of our vast mountain islands, and the natural vegetation sea of the sace.

Conservation and preservation are our job: thus, the empty Burden Basilest. Pick it up and get to work, it needs to be filled."
