



Fish and Wildlife Habitat

A fish and wildlife habitat conservation activity plan is a site-specific strategy to help a landowner manage working lands to improve fish and wildlife resources.

NRCS Technical Service Providers (TSPs) prepare these plans using inputs such as:

- Habitat assessment guides
- Evaluations of carrying capacities for selected species and resources
- Assessments of fish and wildlife populations

Conservation practices recommended in such a plan can include:

- Aquaculture ponds
- Wetland restoration or creation
- Fish passage
- Upland and wetland wildlife habitat management
- Wildlife watering facilities
- Prescribed grazing
- Prescribed burning
