



Pollinator Habitat Enhancement

A pollinator habitat enhancement conservation activity plan is a site-specific strategy that helps a landowner improve, restore, enhance, and expand flower-rich habitats that support native and managed pollinators.

NRCS Technical Service Providers (TSPs) prepare these plans using inputs such as:

- Existing and planned Habitat Suitability Index models
- Assessments of flowering plant populations
- Recordkeeping
- Monitoring

Conservation practices recommended in such a plan can include:

- Conservation cover
- Field borders
- Range planting
- Riparian forest buffers
- Tree/Shrub establishment
- Vegetative barriers
